Endings and stress

Neutral endings

Neutral endings: no influence on stress

límit<u>ed</u>, debát<u>ed</u>, súpplement<u>ed</u>, décorat<u>ed</u> cómpromis<u>es</u>, advántag<u>es</u>, cátegoriz<u>es</u> stábiliz<u>er</u>, intérpret<u>er</u>, abólish<u>ing</u>, líkeli<u>hood</u>, pòlitícian<u>hood</u>, ínfinite<u>ly</u>, définite<u>ness</u>, fínal<u>ize</u>, dócument<u>able</u>

 but prefér → préferable, admíre → ádmirable, compáre → cómparable

Non-neutral endings

- Tonic (=self-stressed) endings
- Post-tonic (=stress-fixing) endings
- Weak endings

Tonic (=self-stressed) endings

paráde, lèmonáde quèstionnáire, millionáire degrée, rèfugée ènginéer, carréer Chìn<u>ése</u>, Jàpan<u>ése</u> cass<u>étte</u>, cìgar<u>étt</u>e technique, critique ballóon, cartóon pòetéss, mànageréss

Exceptions:

pédigree, cóffee, commíttee áctress, hóstess, cóuntess, émpress (disyllables in -ess; but prìncéss regular)

Post-tonic (=stress-fixing) endings

histór<u>ic,</u> àcadém<u>ic</u> tutórial, mànagérial

òpposítion, dècorátion

Canádian, grammárian

melódious, victórious

pecúl<u>iar</u>, famíl<u>iar</u>

habítual, perpétual

contínuous

constít<u>uent</u>

Stress on preceding syll.

-ic(al), -iV..., -uV...

Exc.: Cátholic, pólitics, Árabic, aríthmetic, héretic lúnatic, rhétoric, ársenic

spíritual (vs. habítual)

Weak endings

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phótograph → photógraphy
órigin → orígin<u>al</u>
réal → reál<u>ity</u>
rídicule → ridículous
(3-syllable window!)
horízon → hòrizóntal
(adjective: heavy syll.)
sólid → solídify
("long" verb: Type IV)
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Integrated into word →
not post-tonic but may
change place of
stress

The disyllabic suffixes
-ity, -ify can also be
analysed as posttonic endings
