A vizsga menete:

1. A hallgató egy-egy tételt húz a 8-8, előre meghirdetett irodalmi ill. nyelvészeti tételekből.
2. 15 perc alatt jegyzetet készít magának a két témból.
3. Az általa főtételnek kiválasztott témaiban előadja a vizsgabizottság előtt a feleletét, ill. válaszol a vizsgabizottság tagjainak kérdéseire.
4. Hozzávetőlegesen 5 percen keresztül a vizsgabizottság tagjainak kérdéseire válaszol a melléktétel vázlata alapján.
5. A bizottság értékeli a hallgató teljesítményét, de eredményhirdetés csak akkor történik, miután a teljes zárószigorlat lezajlott.

1. Consonants in English and Hungarian [consonantal processes in RP/GA, potential problems for Hungarians, voice vs. aspiration, -ed/-s, phonotactic differences]
2. Vowels in English and Hungarian [segment inventories, differences between RP and GA, potential problems for Hungarians, tense-lax vowel alternations, vowel reduction]
3. Rhythm and stress in English [speech rhythm language typology, degrees and regularities of word stress in English and Hungarian, processes affecting unstressed syllables, strong and weak forms of function words, neutral vs. non-neutral morphology]
4. The relationship between spelling and pronunciation in English [pronunciation of vowel letters (sound values, graphic positions, letter-to-sound rules) and of (selected) consonant letters and digraphs]
5. Genetic and typological classifications of English and Hungarian [the place of English within IE, the place of Hungarian within Uralic, typological differences between English and Hungarian in morphology and syntax, configurationality, SVO, *pro*-drop, dummy elements]
6. The classification of the major accents of English [geographical distribution, “English type” / “American type” accents, rhotic / non-rhotic accents, split FOOT-STRUT accents, broad BATH accents, tapping accents, etc.]
7. Aspects of the phrasal syntax of English [NPs (determiners, countability, etc.), VPs (the complementation of main verbs), the structure of the verb group (sequencing and combinations of auxiliaries and main verbs), multi-word verbs (“phrasal verbs”)]
8. Aspects of the clausal syntax of English [coordination vs. subordination, formal and functional divisions of clauses, non-finite clauses, empty and dummy subjects, relative clauses, tenses, passivisation & related constructions]
