Minimal formal requirements for BA theses in English linguistics

Unless these requirements are met, the thesis should not be recommended for submission and/or accepted for evaluation with respect to content:

- 1. The thesis is within the length limit (as specified in the guidelines for English Studies BA theses, downloadable from the institute website, and/or advised by the supervisor)
- 2. As certified by the signed originality statement attached to the thesis, it contains no lifting or plagiarism, and no part of its text has been produced by generative Al
- 3. The language (incl. punctuation) used meets the criteria of CEFR Level C1
- 4. The thesis contains every part required by the guidelines (a title page, a plagiarism/originality statement, a table of contents, the text divided into chapters, references at the end)
- 5. The body of the text is organised into consecutively numbered chapters (and subchapters), which are in turn organised into paragraphs
- 6. The thesis uses a consistent system of in-text referencing, and contains a references list at the end, in one of the established Author-Date formats (as advised in the guidelines for linguistics theses, downloadable from the institute website)
- 7. The references list provides proper bibliographic data, with (at least) the surnames of the sources' authors adequately given, and the items *alphabetically* organised *according to those surnames*
- 8. The majority of the sources used in the thesis (and thus listed in the references list) are *academic* ones (books, book chapters, journal articles)
