TEACHING LANGUAGE

COURSES TAUGHT IN FRENCH

Most courses at Unil are taught in French. Students' French language skills must be **at least equivalent to level B2 of the CEFR**. Students who do not meet this requirement must enrol in the French as a foreign language courses (see below).

COURSES TAUGHT IN ENGLISH

- **At Bachelor level**, several courses are taught in English in the Faculty of Business and Economics, in the School of Biology, and in English literature.
- **At Master level**, programmes taught in English are offered in Geology, Environmental Geosciences, Business, Finance, Economics and English Literature.
- A PDF list of **courses taught in English** is available on go.unil.ch/incomingstudy.
- **Students wishing to attend these courses must have sound academic skills, and English language skills at least equivalent to the level B2 of the CEFR.**
- Students planning to attend courses in English are advised to have basic French knowledge for daily life and social integration.

COURSES IN FRENCH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE

LE FIL DE L'EFLE (INTENSIVE COURSES IN FRENCH)

FIL offers 3-week intensive and semi-intensive courses in French language during the summer and winter breaks (A0-C1 levels). It is possible to get 4 ECTS credits for the intensive courses only. Students must pay for these courses, unless included in the exchange agreement.

ÉCOLE DE FRANÇAIS LANGUE ÉTRANGÈRE (SCHOOL OF FRENCH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE)

The School of French as a Foreign Language offers French-language courses during the fall and spring semesters for students from beginner (A0) to advanced levels (C1). Students can study French part-time (A0 to C1) alongside courses taught in English and/or French (min. level B2 required); or can study French full-time (B1 to C1 levels only). Credits can be obtained and courses are free of charge for exchange students.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION AND TRANSCRIPTS

COURSES NOT OPEN TO EXCHANGE STUDENTS

- School of Medicine (except specific SEMP agreements)
- School of Criminal Justice
 - Except the Master of Law in Criminology and Security
 - Bachelor/Master in Forensic Sciences: a written request must be sent to the Direction of the School
- All MSc offered by the School of Biology
- MSc in Accounting, Control and Finance
- MSc in Human Taphonomy
- Executive programmes (EMBA, MAS, etc.)
- Some courses may require prerequisites and approval of the Master programme's director

CREDITS AND GRADES

Unil uses ECTS credits. Grading scale is from 0 (lowest grade) to 6 (highest grade). Passing grade is 4.

COURSE LOAD

We expect our exchange students to complete at least 15 ECTS during their exchange semester at Unil and recommend that they do not exceed 30 ECTS per semester.

TRANSCRIPTS

Bilateral agreements: the original transcript is sent to the exchange office of the partner institution at the end of February for the autumn semester and at the end of August for the spring semester.

INSURANCE

Foreign students must have a health and accident insurance coverage that complies with Swiss regulations. If a foreign health and accident insurance does not offer the minimum coverage required by Swiss law, the exchange student will have to contract a Swiss health and accident insurance for international students. European students can benefit from the minimum coverage required by Swiss law if they have a European Health Insurance Card.

IMMIGRATION

VISA

Non-European students must apply for a type D visa, intended for stays of more than 90 days, at the Swiss diplomatic representation in their home country at least 3 months before their arrival in Switzerland. Students from European Union countries are not required to complete these formalities.

RESIDENCE PERMIT

Upon arrival in Switzerland, the student must apply for a residence permit at the Population Office of their town of residence. **Important:** this procedure is mandatory for any stay exceeding 3 months.
