

*Armenians in Central and Eastern Europe* (historical developments, formation in the early-modern and modern period)

The Armenians in Central and Eastern Europe (Hungary, Romania, Poland, Ukraine) are outside the research focus despite their categorical and effective resemblance to the better explored allochthonous Jews and Germans in East Central Europe. The landscapes and especially the towns of Transylvania, Pannonia and Galicia have been culturally and architecturally shaped by Armenians. This adds to the economic dimension of Armenian presence – and also for “internal” Armenian affairs East Central Europe plays a vital role in culture and the fine arts.
